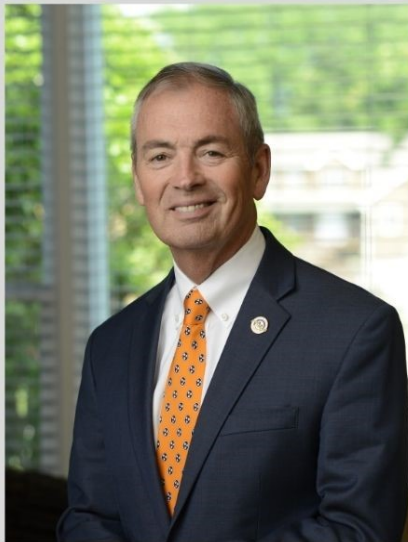

# 2023 WILSON COUNTY AG HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES NAMED *submitted*

In 2007, a group of concerned Wilson Countians came together to form the Wilson County Agricultural Hall of Fame. Since Wilson County was founded back in 1799, Agriculture has been a cornerstone of this community. To recognize the contributions of the many folks involved in agriculture to our community, the Wilson County Agricultural Hall of Fame was organized. Each year, at least four (4) Wilson Countians are recognized during a banquet designed to bring attention to Agriculture's prominent place in our county.

The 16th Wilson County Agricultural Hall of Fame Banquet will take place on April 4, 2023, in the Farm Bureau Expo Building at the Ward Agricultural Center in Lebanon with a reception at 6:00 pm and the actual banquet at 6:30 pm. The organizers have established a non-profit status for the organization to enable them to raise money to be used for a building on the Ward Agricultural Center to be dedicated to the individuals inducted into the Wilson County Agricultural Hall of Fame. "Any funds raised over and above the costs of putting on the annual banquet will be set aside for the building," states Diane Major, Treasurer of the Hall of Fame, Tickets for the April 4 banquet can be purchased by calling 615-444-1890 ext. 3.

The cost is \$20 each. Jordan's Catering will be preparing the meal that evening, which is another reason to join in on the festivities. "We want folks to come together to recognize these deserving individuals on April 4," says Harrison. 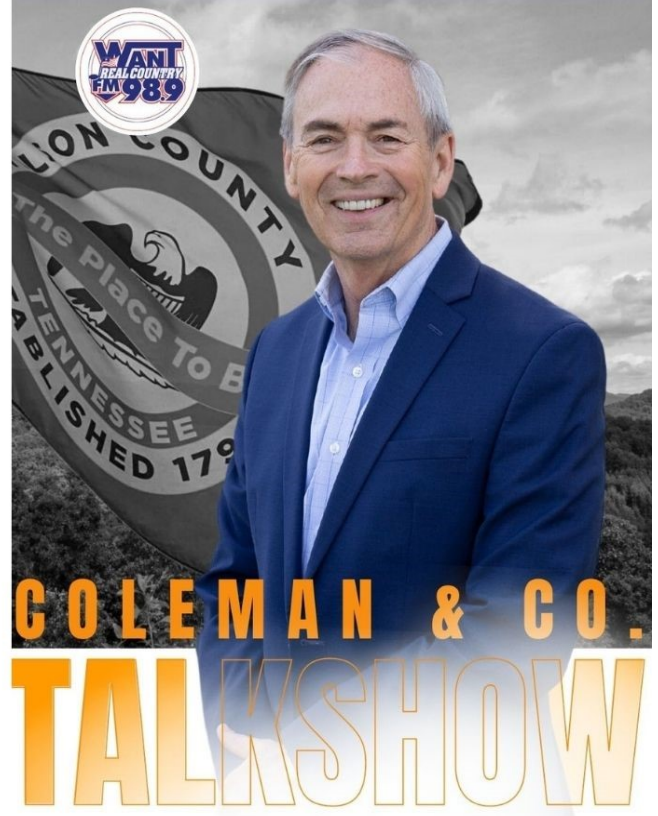

## Wilson County Archives Department Receives TSLA Grant

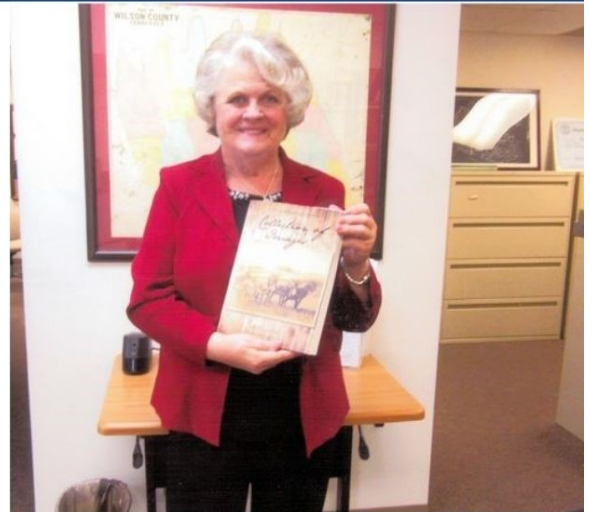
The Wilson County Archives Department has been awarded a local archives development grant each year for over twenty consecutive years. Last October, the Archives department received the official award notice of a local archives development grant for \$1,880. While this may not seem to be a substantial amount compared to other grants that we hear about today, these funds greatly appreciated, as they help see to archival supplies which aid the process of taking care of the older records.

The Wilson County Archives Department's main objective is to preserve county records. These records include everything from marriage certificates and wills to deeds and general Wilson County history. Wilson County Archives preserves documents for county departments that need to be stored and kept on hand for easy access. The documents and records are stored in a clean, temperature and moisture-controlled environment. The Archives Department also provides a variety of services for the general public. For example, Wilson County Archives offers a research library where the public can look up historical information, as well as view older records via microfilm. The Archives Department contains information that is unavailable at any other location in the county.

It is a place that brings county information along with family history together in one place! In addition, the public can also receive copies of older wills, marriage records and deeds. Wilson County Archives is directed under the leadership of Mrs. Linda Granstaff and her staff, Ms. Judy Harris, along with volunteers of over twenty years: Shirley Wilson, Lee Atwood, Catherine Nolen, and Arretha Oakley. These volunteers assist with the preservation of records and daily operations of the department. Ms. Granstaff has made several improvements to the Archives Department over the years, including securing a grant for a computerized microfilm reader. In addition, Mrs. Granstaff has also authored several books, including her collection: "Collection of Images: Looking Back at Precious Memories, Volume I, II, III, IV" that are available to view and purchase at the Wilson County Archives.

We would like to send a special THANK YOU shout-out to the team in the Archives Development Program, as well as the staff at the Tennessee State Library and Archives. Congratulations to Mrs. Granstaff and her team on being awarded the TSLA grant!

continued from page 13... This was awarded to the non-profit that has positively influenced the community in 2022 and has made tremendous strides in helping people with their quality of life.

"It was an honor to accept these two awards on behalf of Wilson Rides," Wilson said. "So many people have contributed to seeing this dream become a reality for our senior citizens in our community. Our driver-volunteers are the heart of our non-profit and they do an amazing job with our riders." Wilson started as Executive Director in February of 2021 as the first Executive Director of the non-profit and recently added staff. In February of 2023, Wilson Rides hired Cathy Rhodes as the new Transportation Coordinator. Rhodes will work with the volunteer drivers on scheduled appointments, among other duties.

"It's an honor to have a front-row seat to watch Gaye Lynn Wilson and her volunteers blessing so many senior citizens," Wilson Rides Board Chair Maggie Lea said. "From doctors' appointments to rides to the grocery store, Wilson Rides is making a tangible difference every day to so many people."

Wilson Rides will be celebrating its 3rd Anniversary of being awarded 501c3 non-profit status in April of this year and its 2nd Anniversary of giving rides in May. The inaugural first ride took place on May 25, 2021. It went from Del Webb Lake Providence Senior Living Community to Just Love Cafe in Mount Juliet, where honorary volunteer driver Mark Hinesley of the Mount Juliet Chamber of Commerce drove Mrs. Gloria Wilson to get her favorite coffee. Since that special day in May of 2021, Wilson Rides has given over 587 round trips

throughout Wilson County, and volunteer drivers have driven over 29,832 miles collectively.
